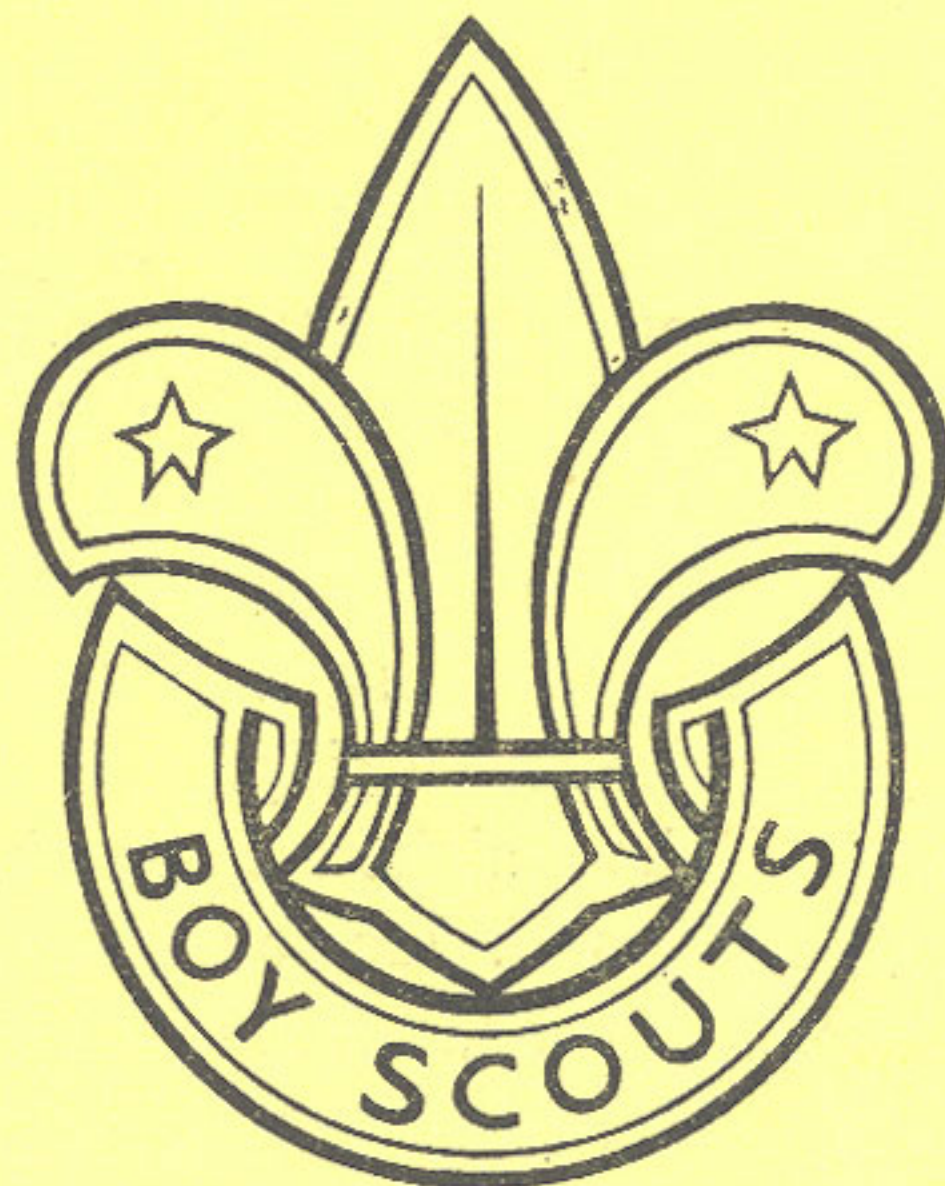

Baden-Powell House

AFTER a ten-year search a suitable site has been found on which to build a permanent memorial to the Founder of the Boy Scout Movement, Robert Baden-Powell. The site is a valuable one, standing at the junction of Queen's Gate and Cromwell Road, Kensington, not far from B.-P.'s old London home, and it is within easy reach of Victoria, Waterloo and the new Airway Terminal.

B.-P. House is designed to provide accommodation for visiting Scouts from other lands and the provinces and will also incorporate a dining hall, assembly hall and accommodation for a Scout Club. A feature of the House will be a room set aside for all Baden-Powell's trophies and mementoes.

In 1942, the year after B.-P.'s death, a Memorial Fund, restricted to members of the Scout Movement, was opened and the proceeds invested in War Stocks. With accrued interest, the sum totalled over £180,000 by 1956 and out of this the site has now been paid for, leaving a considerable amount to be found, not only for building and furnishing the House but also for an endowment to meet the cost of maintenance.

All over the country, Scouts are contributing to this great cause, mainly by the use of collecting "bricks". May we ask you, our "GANG SHOW" audience, to help us in this work, by putting a contribution in the "bricks" which will be found in the foyer.
