

From our district commissioner

Officially the longest continuously running Gang Show in the world! Doesn't it make your spine tingle with pride to hear that superlative for our little town in Hertfordshire that manages to produce excellence unmatched by anywhere else "In The World" (as Jeremy Clarkson would say)?

There's another unofficial statistic about Harpenden and Scouting that we think is true, but we can't be absolutely sure about, and that is that Scouting happens more intensively here than anywhere else ... In The World:

- Globally, 0.4% of the world's population are young people participating in Scouting.
- In the UK that figure rises to 0.55%.
- In Hertfordshire that rises to 1.2%.
- In Harpenden and Wheathampstead it reaches a stunning 3.5%.

We have 10 Scout meeting places with 250 wonderful leaders and 1,236 young people participating every week. Sadly, we have over 200 young people of Scouting age who have registered an interest in participating but whom we can't currently accommodate.

With the continuing expansion of Harpenden already in evidence from increased housing and the pressure on schools, we can assume that the demand for Scouting places will continue to edge up towards "2020 by 2020". And some of those new houses will have children wanting to be Beavers – of that I have no doubt.

The Scout Association is creating the citizens of tomorrow and we need the support to create the resources for this today. Those of you who have read my message in this programme over the last five years will be very familiar with my plea for more leaders, and I am delighted with the quantity and quality of leaders who have come on board in recent years.

As I prepare to hand over to a new District Commissioner, I am very aware that premises are our next challenge. Young people don't want to have to meet for Scouts in the same place they've been all day for school. We call upon everyone in the town to halve up not the three previous.

in the town to help us get the three new Scout huts we will need to continue to create the best young citizens ... In The World.

We are family!

11 lucky Scouts from this District, several of whom you will see on this stage, will find out later this year exactly what the 'family of Scouting' means at the World Scout Jamboree in Japan. Closer to home, family is what it's all about. 21 members of this year's Gang have parents who were in the Show in the 1980s (two have a grandfather who was in our earliest shows!).

The young people on stage can be rightly proud of what they have achieved over these past 17 weeks of rehearsal as a Gang, as friends, as family. Harpenden & Wheathampstead District Scout Gang Show will go on growing, but we have found the secret of eternal youth, the philosopher's stone. It is, quite simply, a sense of family. It abounds in the cast, in the support from parents and friends and, just as importantly, in you the audience, which is why you come back year after year. Thank you.

So now, it's time to sit back and enjoy the show (and if you like what you see and would like to be a part of this family's support network, you only have to ask!).

Chairman's Welcome

In 1907 an experimental camp on Brownsea Island confirmed to our founder that Scouting was a good idea. Over a century on and Scouting is active in over 200 countries and territories around the world with a membership in excess of 30 million!

In 1972, twenty four years before any of this year's Gang Show cast had been born, I was a Scout Leader at the 3rd Harpenden and Ian Fulton became the District Chairman. After serving the District in this role for a stunning 42 years and working with six District Commissioners, Ian retired in 2014. Thank you, Ian, for your time, effort, enthusiasm and support.

In 2014 Scouting in Harpenden, Kimpton and Wheathampstead was enjoyed by over 1200 people, thousands of badges were awarded, nights camping enjoyed, sausages burnt and friends made. We are also planning the support for eleven Jamboree participants going to Japan in 2015.

In 2056 and in 2121, I predict, Scouting will still be thriving. So, what changes? Not the thing that makes Scouting so enduring - our core aim of encouraging and supporting the development of young people and empowering them to make a positive contribution to society. What does change and needs to keep changing is the way that is achieved. And that takes a great deal of effort – from people who wear the uniform and those who don't. Running training programmes, maintaining huts, raising funds, organising Gang Shows, keeping the accounts, running meetings, training the leaders, doing the paperwork, ...Thank you all.

If only we had more of all this energy and more places to meet we could offer Scouting magic to all who seek it and have no waiting lists. I hope we don't have to wait until 2056.

1st Harpenden Scout Group First

2014 was another action-filled year for the 1st.

The Beavers enjoyed a torchlight scavenger hunt, played rounders with another pack and made s'mores by campfire. In September, they went geocaching in Heartwood, where a member of public used the geocache to help a Beaver find the Colony. His log takes up the story:

"I parked up and on the way to GZ (Ground Zero) I met up with a rather distressed lady and her young grandson, who asked me if I'd seen a group of Beavers in the area since she was supposed to be meeting them but had got lost on the way. I asked the lad if he was part of the 1st Harpenden and he confirmed that he was. We therefore followed the GPS to GZ, with a potted lesson on caching for gran on the way and there they were...the 1st Harpenden! After a big hug from gran I signed the log and said my goodbyes."

The Cubs paid a visit to the fire station and launched homemade rockets from Nomansland. In May they had a superb camp at Phasels Wood.

The Scouts' programme included a sleepover, Quasar and an astronomy evening. The highlight was the Brownsea Camp - they were lucky

enough to pitch at the very site of B-P's first camp. Activities included archery, sailing and kayaking (the GSL was first to capsize, ha!)

In July, all sections joined the Methodist Church and other Scout and Guide groups for a Sponsored Water Carry from Batford to the High Street, an effort that raised over £8,000 for Water Aid.

In September we had a great Family Camp at Henlow, where the indifferent weather failed to dampen spirits and we produced some of the best cardboard ovens ever seen. To top off the year everyone enjoyed our "Gunge A Leader" event and you can see the results for yourself!

It is heart-warming that despite how 2nd has come together from across the District, such a friendly and collaborative community has built up, showing itself in the wide variety of ways that parents help out, in the friendships our young people have forged across school divides, and in generosity shown by our trailer load of Food Bank contributions in Scout Community Week.

This year our hut has undergone yet more refurbishment works to make our premises much more user friendly.

The Beaver Colony is full – with 24 children all invested.
Children have participated in a range of activities this
year – we are now into the second cycle of our two year
rolling plan and have covered badge work including the
Friendship Challenge, gardening, adventure, health and
fitness and the new Disability Badge. There are several
parents regularly helping out at meetings and most
importantly we have managed to 'recruit' two new Assistant
Beaver Leaders.

We have had a very busy year with some very enthusiastic Cubs. Earlier in the year we were lucky enough to welcome Paul Gillett as a leader who has been a great addition to our leadership team. We have had a variety of fun evenings including an evening hike around Rothamsted which included

walking through Knott Wood in the pitch darkness and an evening lighting fires and toasting marshmallows, which was very sticky! Our Cubs who have been working very hard at several activity badges including the Disability Badge and Map Readers badge.
