## Brief Guide to the Gangs

Our Gang of 149 is made up of several parts: Mini Gang, Junior Gang and Senior Gang, out of which are selected several soloists and a Dance Team made up of 16 Explorers.

The 36 Mini Gang members are 10 and 11 year old Cubs and Scouts. You will see them in the Mini Gang feature every Show, and also in the finale of the Friday and Saturday Shows (they get too tired if we let them do every Show!).

The Junior Gang is 61 Scouts aged between 11 and 14 years old.

The Senior Gang is made up of 52 Explorers from across the District, with a top age of 18.

While there are no auditions to take part in the Show, once started we audition for soloists and our Dance Team.

And finally, the man waving his arms around in front of the orchestra is Ewan Murray, our Producer and Musical Director.









## A year in the Life of Gang Show

Each January the Cubs, Scouts and Explorers of the District provide Harpenden with a fantastic Show of song, dance and laughter. The energy and talent that you see on stage each year is a culmination of 12 months' hard work and dedication.

**February -** Basking in the happy memories of the previous Show and sowing the seeds of ideas for next year.

**March** - Time for the Creative Team to start putting pen to paper with themes, music, dance and sketches. Cubs, Scouts and Explorers apply to be in the Show, keeping everything crossed that they will be lucky.

**April - June -** Ideas grow and develop and the Show starts to take shape.

**May** - The happiest and hardest email to receive – happy for those who have been lucky and are in Gang Show, and hard for those who are on the waiting list. Some may be lucky and get a late call up.

**July** - The first glimpse of the Show for the Gang – the revealing of the songs and dances, with the Dance Team being chosen. Sharing the Show with the backstage crew – always a few surprised faces at having to produce unusual costumes, props and scenery!







September - Rehearsals start, every Tuesday evening for Mini and Junior Gang and Sunday afternoons for Senior Gang.



November - December -Nobody panic!! We will be ready in time!

January - Moving to the Public Halls for dress rehearsals and final tweaks and then ... the Show that we have all been waiting for!

## Interview with the Creative Director

You'll be wondering how 149 Scouts of varying ages look so coordinated and energetic on stage. It's all down to our Creative Director, Cathy Washbrooke, and her team.



Where did you study dance and choreography? I studied Dance Theatre at Trinity Laban Dance Conservatoire, before qualifying as a teacher. Later I studied a Masters in Dance, Performance and Choreography at Coventry University. At the moment I'm doing a PhD in "Outdoor Site-Specific Dance" so you'll have to wait and see whether some of the numbers take place on Harpenden Common in the years to come!

Where do you find your inspiration? First I listen to the Gang Show songs about 100 times each! I find the ideas

then emerge for how the dances might be staged. I am always looking for the more innovative ideas so that the Show is continually evolving.

I also get my inspiration from real life; I go and see performances and art exhibitions, and absorb the atmosphere of places and objects. Ideas come when I'm travelling, especially when I'm on trains. There's something about the world flying by that fills my head with ideas.

I work closely with David Errock in our Audio Visual team to get the dance tracks just right, all the way to the end. (Thank you, David, for being so patient.)

What do you love about Gang Show? I love working with young people and enjoy incorporating their ideas in the choreographic process. This year, it's the first time for most of the 16-strong Dance Team. Almost all of them have been in the Gang before, but Dance Team means a lot more rehearsals, new dance styles and dance technique. It's great fun working with such an enthusiastic Dance Team, but it can be challenging, as we all have to get used to different learning and teaching styles. I need the Gang to go with the creative flow – and that's something that not everyone's used to!

I love the stage when the Gang suddenly learns to convey their energy - you can feel it in the audience and the Show starts fizzing.

Who's in the team? My fellow choreographers this year are Wendy Bideau, who has taught the boys' tap number for many years, former Dance Team member, Becca Leigh, who is studying for a Masters



in Dance Performance and Nuria Martinez, who is a professional ballet dancer and brings expertise in the technical aspects of performance. We are also lucky to have ex-Gang members helping to teach the Junior Gang this year.

We would welcome anyone who can bring innovative ideas to dance and performance and who loves collaborating with young people. If you are interested, please email the Creative Team at producer@harpenden.gs. You don't need to be a Scout leader, or even to have been a Scout!



## **International Camps**

Hi everyone,


Russ, our District Commissioner, asked me earlier this year to take on the role of Youth District Commissioner. My first question was what is that? I see my role as a champion for young people in Scouting. It is my job to communicate with the young people in all our sections and make sure that their voices are heard in planning what they want to do. This means that they can help shape the future of Scouting.

I've been Scouting in Harpenden for the last 9 years. Starting as a Scout at 4th, moving to Explorers at KES, becoming first a young leader and now an adult leader at 2nd.
